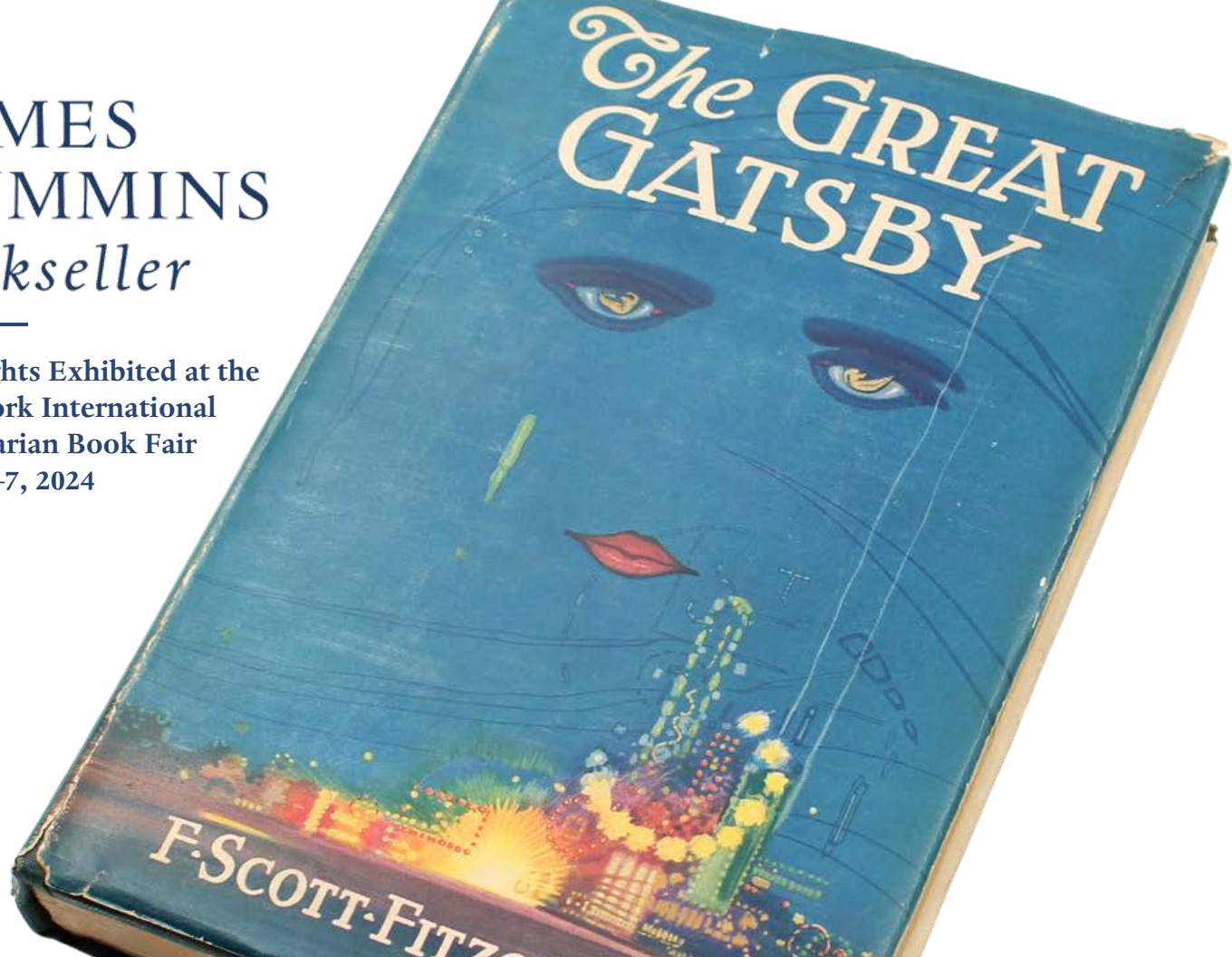

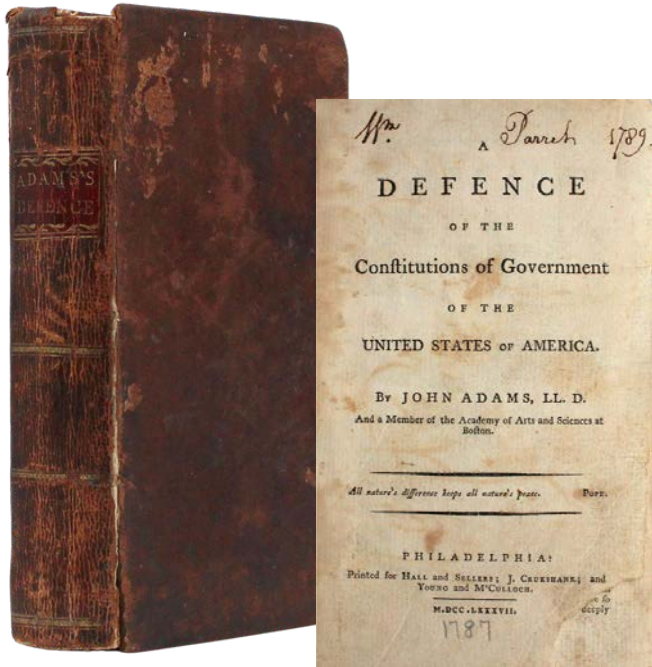


64TH ANNUAL ABAA NEW YORK INTERNATIONAL ANTIQUARIAN BOOK FAIR



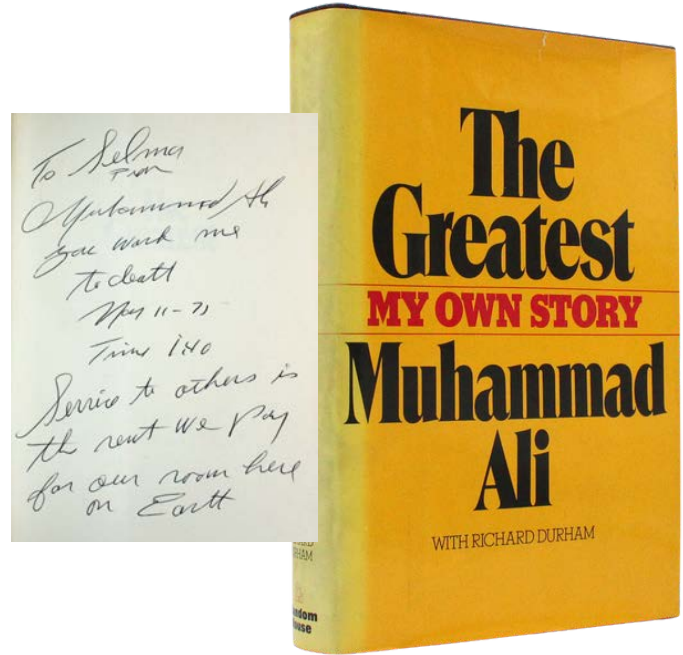

To commemorate the 500th anniversary of Giovanni da Verrazzano's discovery of New York Harbor, James Cummins Bookseller — in conjunction with Peter Harrington, William Reese Company, and Horden House — is offering at the New York Antiquarian Book Fair a remarkable collection of printed works and manuscripts documenting the pivotal moments when European explorers first set foot on the uncharted shores of the New World.

Curated from the final collection of Robert David Parsons (1939–2014), this unparalleled assemblage includes, in the words of the late Parsons himself, the texts of seaborne discovery, exploration and settlement from the era of Columbus until that point in the first half of the nineteenth century when little remained to be discovered.”

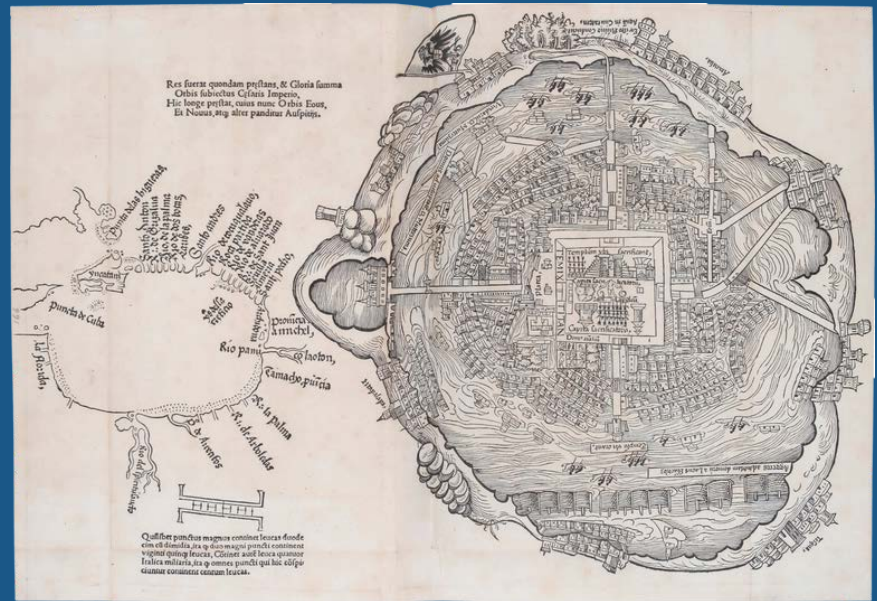
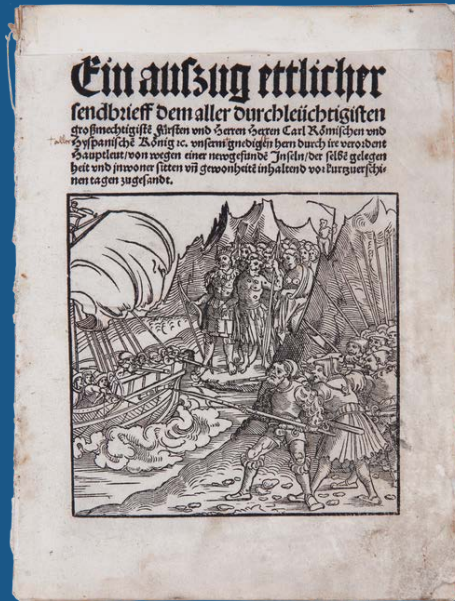
From the book by Waldseemüller that first named America, to the first eyewitness description of the North American mainland by Fr. Juan Diaz, the first printed description of Brazil in Vespucci's *Novas Mundus*, and the famed 1513 Ptolemy, the very first atlas to contain a map of America, the collection chronicles several exceptional “firsts” from the Age of Discovery.
